

MINUTES

I. CALL TO ORDER:

This meeting was called to order by the Chairman, Chief Justice F. Philip Carbullido, at 12:55 p.m.

II. ROLL CALL:

III. PROOF OF DUE NOTICE OF MEETING:

"Notice of Public Meeting" was published in Marianas Variety on Friday, August 17, 2012 and Friday, August 24, 2012.

IV. DETERMINATION OF QUORUM:

With the presence of four (4) board members, a quorum was determined for this meeting.

V. <u>APPROVAL OF MINUTES:</u> Minutes of the regular board meeting held on Tuesday, June 26, 2012 were adopted and approved subject to corrections.

VI. OLD BUSINESS:

A. Financial Status Update (PDSC and APD Allotment Releases): Chief Fiscal Officer, Cecilia A.T. Lizama, reported that PDSC received the first half of August 2012, as of this date, which is 90% of the scheduled allotments. An additional \$60,000 was received to cover the appropriation for medical, dental and life insurance premiums; the funding source for this was supposed to be from the GWA Reimbursement Fund, which never materialized.

For Alternate Public Defender (APD), 91% of the scheduled allotment releases (through July 2012), have been received to date. A release for the first half of August 2012 is expected to be released later in the week.

Note: Chief Justice Carbullido related that he has received information relative to the Fiscal Year 2013 budget appropriation for the PDSC. Apparently, the legislature took Fiscal Year 2012 appropriation levels and rolled them over to Fiscal Year 2013, but subsequently cut approximately 5% (five percent) of that amount (under Miscellaneous Provisions). He directed the Corporation to review the numbers, and come up with an Action Plan as to how the impact of these shortages will be dealt with.

- **B.** Domestic Violence Program Update: Chief Fiscal Officer Cecilia A.T. Lizama informed those present that funding for the months of May and June 2012 were received. PDSC Operations Fund continues to provide advances for the program.
- C. Alternate Public Defender Update: APD Supervising Attorney Annie Gayle related that the APD's Fiscal Year 2013 Budget Request was approved by the Judicial Council on August 23, 2012.
- Night Differential (Development and Implementation of Policy Governing Night Differential Pay): PDSC Executive Director Miller presented the Corporation's proposed policy, which is parallel to the relevant statute on this subject. He also noted that a response to his request for a legal opinion from the Attorney General's office has not been received. This matter was tabled until the next board meeting in order to allow some time for members to review the proposed policy.
- E. Director's Performance Review (5GCA §43201): This item was deferred until the next board meeting due to CathyAnn Gogue being off-island at this time.
- F. Representation of Current Clients in Related Protective Order Cases: This agenda item was combined with item H (PDSC's Policy for Conflicts of Interest).
- G. Resolution No. 13-12 (Continued Moratorium on Civil and Domestic Cases): Addressing the high caseloads of PDSC attorneys, this resolution essentially continued the current moratorium on civil and domestic cases indefinitely.

Certain exceptions (i.e., uncontested guardianships, burial of expired bodies, and domestic cases involving violence or the threat of violence) may continue to be accepted by the Corporation (within prescribed eligibility criteria), through December 31, 2012 whereupon this matter will be revisited for further action.

H. PDSC's Policy for Conflicts of Interest: PDSC Director Eric Miller reported that the Conflicts Committee met and will meet again in early September to continue discussions on this matter, and to draft a proposal which will be presented at the next board meeting. Attorney Miller is conducting further research on this.

Chief Justice Carbullido directed that this item be kept on the agenda for the next meeting.

VII. NEW BUSINESS:

A. Formation of Task Force re: Development of Civil Division Within the PDSC: PDSC Director Eric Miller presented this matter, and proposed that a Civil Division within the Corporation will be structured similar to the Alternate Public Defender. Administrative duties and costs will be shared with the PDSC, so operational expenses will be minimized. Current resources are inadequate for this project to materialize. However, if the legislature and/or federal grants are able to fund more attorney positions, as well as minimal administrative staff, this may be possible. The Task Force will continue to explore other funding sources for this program.

Chief Justice Carbullido reiterated the importance of this matter, and the high priority it is for the PDSC. While he is cognizant of the Corporation's priority with criminal cases, he supports any further endeavors to lift the present moratorium on civil cases. He directed that plans and ideas regarding this objective be presented to the legislature for the next budget cycle, and to push for additional funding in order to realize this goal.

Acting Presiding Judge James Canto was appointed Chairman of this Task Force; Attorney Cynthia Ecube will be submitting her recommendation of additional members to Director Eric Miller.

B. For Informational Purposes: Purchase of Software Updates/Licenses for AbacusLaw (Case Management System): PDSC MIS Administrator Julito Tingson informed those present that technical support upgrades for this software are necessary in order to maximize available services. Although some funding was requested for Fiscal Year 2013, we won't know the true amount available until after the budget bill is passed.

This item was deferred for thirty (30) days, pending the passage of the Fiscal Year 2013 Budget Bill by the legislature.

Judge Canto also invoked the possibility of looking into other case management software/systems for the PDSC.

- C. Retirement of Florenzo P. Fejeran, Chief Special Investigator and Cecilia A.T. Lizama, Chief Fiscal Officer: The retirement of these PDSC employees on September 28, 2012 was announced, along with a celebration honoring them which is set for Thursday, September 27, 2012 at The View, Marriott Hotel from 6:00 to 11:00 p.m. Board members were invited.
- VIII. PUBLIC DISCUSSION: None.
- IX. ADJOURNMENT AND NEXT MEETING DATE: There being no further business up for discussion, this meeting was adjourned at 1:43 p.m. The next meeting was then tentatively scheduled for September 25, 2012 at 12:30 p.m.

Public Defender Service Corporation NIGHT DIFFERENTIAL PAY POLICY

STATEMENT OF POLICY

All PDSC employees, except the Executive Director, shall be entitled to night differential pay, calculated at the rate of their regular wage plus ten percent (10%), for all authorized periods worked between the hours of 6:00 pm and 6:00 am. (4 GCA §6217)

ADMINISTRATIVE PROVISIONS

- A. <u>Eligibility for Pay</u>: All PDSC employees, except the Executive Director, shall be entitled to night differential pay for all applicable authorized periods worked.
- B. <u>Applicable Hours/Periods Worked</u>: For the purpose of this policy, applicable hours/periods worked shall refer to any and all authorized hours worked by eligible employees between the hours of 6:00 pm and 6:00 am.
 - a. <u>Authorized Hours Worked</u>: It shall be the responsibility of all supervisors to manage workloads of the Corporation in an effort to minimize the need for night differential payments. Night differential payments shall only be authorized for hours worked by eligible employees and required by the employee's supervisor, or higher authority, within the applicable period to respond to urgent needs of the Corporation which was not a result of the employee's negligence, as determined by the Director.
 - b. <u>Unauthorized Hours Worked</u>: Work performed within the applicable period which could have been completed during normal business hours, was not required or authorized by the employee's supervisor or higher authority, or was a result of the employee's negligence, shall not be authorized for Night Differential Pay.
- C. <u>Approvals</u>: Prior to the commencement of any work to be performed by an eligible employee within the applicable period, it shall be the responsibility of the employee to obtain the necessary approval(s) from his/her supervisor and Director utilizing the form prescribed by the Personnel Office. (Director shall refer to the Executive Director for PDSC attorneys, Administrative Director for PDSC support staff employees or the APD Supervising Attorney for employees of the Alternate Public Defender.)
- D. <u>Night Differential Rate</u>: For all applicable approved periods worked, eligible employees shall be paid their regular wage plus ten percent (10%).
 - a. Example: John Doe, Legal Clerk, worked from 8:00 am through 5:00 pm daily, Monday through Friday. Additionally, John Doe worked from 6:00 pm through 8:00 pm that same Friday. The hours worked from 8:00 am through 5:00 pm will be paid at his regular rate and the hours worked after 6:00 pm would be paid at the premium rate (Night Differential Pay). Since John Doe is paid \$10 per hour, his pay for the week shall be calculated as follows:

= \$11.00 x 2 hours

= \$22.00

 $TOTAL\ PAY =$ Regular Rate + Night Differential Pay = \$400.00 + \$22.00 = \$422.00

E. Relation to Overtime, Compensatory/Straight Time, Holiday Pay: Night Differential Pay is in addition to overtime, compensatory/straight time (in lieu of overtime) and holiday pay.

Should any provisions contained within this policy conflict with statute, the statute shall prevail and all remaining provisions shall continue in full force and effect.

(e) Reductions to Operations of the Public Defender Service Corporation.

Effective October 1, 2012, the sum of One Hundred Ninety-Five Thousand Five Hundred Thirty-Three Dollars (\$195,533) is de-appropriated from the amounts appropriated from the General Fund in Chapter VII, Part II and are hereby re-appropriated to the Income Tax Refund Efficient Payment Trust Fund of Chapter 51, Title 11 GCA for income tax refund payments.

(f) Reductions to Operations of the Mayors Council of Guam.

Effective October 1, 2012, the sum of Four Hundred Forty-Three Thousand Seven Hundred Seventy-Six Dollars (\$443,776) is deappropriated from the amounts appropriated from the General Fund in Chapter VIII and are hereby re-appropriated to the Income Tax Refund Efficient Payment Trust Fund of Chapter 51, Title 11, Guam Code Annotated for income tax refund payments.

(g) Reductions to Operations of the Office of Public Accountability.

Effective October 1, 2012, the sum of Sixty-Seven Thousand Seventy-Three Dollars (\$67,073) is de-appropriated from the amounts appropriated from the General Fund in Chapter IX, Part I and are hereby re-appropriated to the Income Tax Refund Efficient Payment Trust Fund of Chapter 51, Title 11 GCA for income tax refund payments.

The Treasurer of Guam, as a ministerial duty, *shall* deposit One Million One Hundred One Thousand One Hundred Forty-Eight Dollars (\$1,101,148) cash from daily collections, which is equal to one-twelfth (1/12) of the total sum reappropriated in this Section by the last day of each month during Fiscal Year 2013

§ 11113. Fiscal Authority Accounting; Expenditures.

- (a) There is hereby established a fund to be known as the "Public Defender Service Corporation Fund," which shall be maintained by the General Administrative Services of the Judicial Branch separate and apart from other funds of the Government, and independent records and accounts shall be maintained in connection therewith. Every quarter the financial statement of the Fund shall be furnished the Guam Legislature.
- (b) All moneys received by the Corporation, from whatever source derived, shall be deposited in said Public Defender Service Corporation Fund in eligible banks as defined in §6311 of the Government Code.
- (c) All expenditures shall be made from said Public Defender Service Corporation Fund.
- (d) The Board shall adopt and maintain a uniform system of accounting.

§ 11113.1. Lapses.

The Public Defender Service Corporation shall be allowed to carry over all lapses from fiscal year to fiscal year, beginning with Fiscal Year 2000, notwithstanding any other provisions of law, or administrative provisions in public laws setting forth each fiscal year's budget. This provision shall remain in effect in all budgets hereafter, unless specifically amended or repealed by subsequent legislation. The language, notwithstanding any other provision of law, shall not constitute a specific repeal of this provision.

WHEREAS.

The PDSC Board of Trustees adopted Resolution No. 99-07 requiring Board approval for the budgeting of and/or spending authorization(s) for these lapsed funds; and

WHEREAS.

Public Law 31-233 ultimately appropriated \$3,601,222 (\$3,796,755-\$195,533) to the PDSC for Fiscal Year 2013, which falls short of the funds required for the Corporation's fulfillment of its mandates and operational costs for this fiscal period; and

WHEREAS,

PDSC has certain operational needs which are imperative for the compliance of certain accounting principles, and Guam law regarding increased rates for the government's share of retirement contributions, salary increments and/or pay adjustments for government employees, as well as the acquisition of various supplies and materials, and other purposes; and

WHEREAS,

PDSC has re-evaluated its spending priorities, and has determined that in order to meet the above-described needs in support of PDSC client services and operations, the use of lapsed funds in Fiscal Year 2013 is necessary; now therefore be it

RESOLVED.

The Board of Trustees of the Public Defender Service Corporation, in its meeting of October 23, 2012, hereby approves the Corporation's request for the expenditure of \$283,469 of lapsed funds for the purposes described in the attached spreadsheet, which is made a part of this resolution, and such expenditures are to be implemented at the discretion of the PDSC Director, in consultation with the Chief Justice and Chairman of the Board, not to exceed the amount of \$283,469

WHEREAS,	the office of the Alternate Public Defender (APD), a separate division of the Public Defender Service Corporation (PDSC), was established through PDSC Board of Trustees Resolution No. 08-04; and
WHEREAS,	the PDSC Board of Trustees approved the APD's Fiscal Year 2013 Budget Request through Board Resolution No. 08-12; and
WHEREAS,	the 2012 Judicial Council of Guam subsequently approved the APD's Fiscal Year 2013 Budget Request through Resolution No. JC 12-013; and
WHEREAS,	the Ninth Annual (Eighth Renewal) Agreement to Provide Attorney Services for Indigent Defendants was forwarded to Staff Attorney Bridget A. Keith in September 2012 (now pending approval and required signatures), affirming funding for the operations of the APD through Fiscal Year 2013; and
WHEREAS,	due to continued budgetary constraints, the PDSC was directed to return to a "maintenance budget" for the Alternate Public Defender's FY2013 operations; and
WHEREAS,	to this end, only mandatory increases (e.g., attorney pay adjustments, pay adjustments/salary increments, increases in the government's share of retirement, medical, dental and life insurance contributions, etc.), were provided for; and
WHEREAS,	the cost of the annual contract for technical support services involving the APD's case management software (Abacus), was not provided for due to the spending reductions; and
WHEREAS,	although the current contract is set to expire in March 2013, the PDSC has received information regarding price increases and the necessity of

continued technical support; and

purchasing upgrades to the present software version in order to ensure

WHEREAS,	these services are critical to the operations of the APD, and recent communications with the respective vendor resulted in a price quote of \$2,695.44 for Fiscal Year 2013; and	
WHEREAS,	a review of the APD's finances has revealed that there are sufficient funds to accommodate this amount; now therefore be it	
RESOLVED,	the Board of Trustees of the Public Defender Service Corporation, in its meeting of October 23, 2012, hereby approves the Corporation's request for the expenditure of \$2,695.44 of APD lapsed funds for the purpose of purchasing software upgrades/technical support services for APD's case management software (Abacus) throughout Fiscal Year 2013.

(d) **Timely Implementation.** The Department of Administration *shall* fully implement the provisions of this Act within forty-five (45) days of its enactment, and failure to do so *shall* authorize the Department of Public Health and Social Services to implement the provisions of this Act where possible, as amended, and *shall* seek necessary retroactive actions from the Department of Administration, including, but not limited to, compensation and personnel action.

Section 38. A new §8113.1 is hereby *added* to Chapter 8 of Title 5 GCA to read:

"§8113.1. Reporting Requirements for Boards and Commissions.

The governing Boards and Commissions of *all* agencies, public corporations, and departments of the government of Guam *shall* provide electronic copies of the monthly Board and Commission meeting agendas, approved minutes, and other attachments and addendums as discussed in each monthly meeting, to *I Maga'låhen Guåhan* and the Speaker of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan no later than* fifteen (15) days after the end of said meeting and post the same on its website of the agency, public corporation, or department to which it governs. The audio recording of each meeting *shall be* provided to the Office of Public Accountability within seven (7) calendar days after the meeting. The Office of Public Accountability *shall* post these audio files on its website upon receipt of audio files."

Section 39. A new §22109.1 is hereby added to Article 1, Chapter 22 of Title 5 GCA to read:

"§22109.1. On-line Electronic Access to Bank Account Information. All banks receiving government funds for deposit in a government bank account established at said bank shall provide "READ ONLY" access to such bank accounts via said bank's on-line banking website or via electronic access via other access source provided to the
