# Trial set for brothers accused in machete attack

The pair accused of hitting passing cars with a machete and rocks in Mangilao could go to trial next month. Emmanuel Reselap, 19, and his brother, Jordan Rachulap, 25, appeared before Judge Vernon Perez of the Superior Court of Guam on Monday.

"My intent is to give you a fair trial," said Perez. "I'm not sure the community will be safe, so I am

holding you until trial."

Perez told both defendants that he would keep them in the custody of the Department of Corrections due to the seriousness of the allegations.

The intended trial date has been scheduled for July 31.

Both have since pleaded not guilty to the charges in the indictment.

Reselap was indicted on charges of attempted murder, terrorizing, criminal mischief and family violence. Rachulap was indicted on charges of terrorizing, aggra-

got into an argument with another man and then stabbed him in the stomach with a machete. Both defendants are accused of then hitting passing vehicles with machetes and throwing rocks.

Multiple vehicles were damaged as a result of the attack.

The incident led to island leaders hosting village town hall meetings to discuss what more could be done to ensure community safety.

Both are scheduled to return to court on July 1.

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# Theft suspect to get off the hook over court delay

The criminal case against a man who was arrested in 2017 on suspicion of stealing a moped and a credit card will have to be dismissed permanently because the defendant's right to be brought before a judge within 48 hours of his arrest was violated, Supreme Court of Guam justices have ruled.

Chief Justice Katherine Maraman, joined by Justice F. Philip Carbullido and Justice Robert J. Torres, issued a written decision Thursday in the case against Mark Anthony Bryan.

According to Guam Daily Post files, police arrested Bryan in 2017 on suspicion of stealing a woman's purse from the trunk of her car that was parked in front of American Grocery in Dededo. A woman used her phone to take a picture of a man riding away from her on a yellow-and-pink moped.

Bryan allegedly admitted that he was on drugs while riding the moped when he stole the purse, which contained her credit cards. He blamed Xanax for his actions. According to court documents,

Bryan was charged with burglary to a motor vehicle as a second-degree felony and theft of a credit card as a misdemeanor.

### 'Procedural failures'

According to the evidence presented in the Superior Court, Bryan was transported to the hospital shortly after he was arrested and was detained for 28 days before being brought before a judge.

The Superior Court found that Bryan's hospitalization was a bona fide emergency or extraordinary circumstance

excusing the obligation to bring a person before a judge within 48 hours of arrest.

However, the Supreme Court's decision points out that "Bryan was still not brought before a judge until weeks after the indictment and another five days after he was formally discharged from the hospital."

In reversing the trial court's decision, the Supreme Court concluded that evidence of hospitalization alone is "insufficient to excuse the 48-hour requirement."

The justices wrote, "even procedural failures can lead to great harm where a criminal defendant's constitutional rights are not respected."

## Interior chief urges Congress to pass Guam's war claims correction bill

The secretary of the U.S. Department of the Interior has endorsed passage of Del. Michael San Nicolas' war claims correction bill.

On June 18, Interior Secretary David Bernhardt sent letters to House Speaker Nancy Pelosi and Senate Majority Leader Mitch McConnell, urging both the House and Senate "to expedite its consideration and approval" of H.R. 1365.

"The Department of the Interior respectfully requests prompt congressional action to enact the bill and thereby allow Treasury to start distrib-

uting payments for certified claims before Guam's historic (liberation) event," Bernhardt wrote.

San Nicolas said he was "deeply grateful for the plain urgency and clear support" expressed by Bernhardt in his letter.

"This clear signal from the administration reassures bipartisan support at the federal level, and affirms that H.R. 1365 is the appropriate vehicle to get War Claims paid," San Nicolas said in a release.

H.R. 1365 was unanimously approved by the House Natural Resources

Committee last week. It's now awaiting a vote by the full House.

San Nicolas introduced the measure to correct flaws in the World War II Loyalty Recognition Act, which was submitted last year by then-Del. Madeleine Bordallo.

Bordallo's bill did not include authorization for the release of reparations already awarded to survivors. As a result, the U.S. Treasury Department has not issued \$6.2 million in compensation awards to 622 of the island's manamko' who are waiting for their checks.

**MINUTES**

**I. CALL TO ORDER:**

The meeting was called to order by the Chairwoman, Chief Justice Katherine A. Maraman at 12:53PM.

**II. ROLL CALL:**

**III. PROOF OF DUE NOTICE OF MEETINGS:**

“Notice of Public Meeting” was published in the Guam Post on Tuesday, April 16, 2019 and Friday, April 19, 2019.

**IV. DETERMINATION OF QUORUM:**

With the presence of four (4) out of the five (5) board members, a quorum was determined for the meeting to proceed.

**V. APPROVAL OF MINUTES:**

Motion to approve the minutes of Thursday, April 4, 2019 was made by Presiding Judge Lamorena and seconded by GBA President Jacque Terlaje. The minutes were adopted and approved, subject to corrections.

**VI. OLD BUSINESS:**

**A. FINANCIAL STATUS UPDATE**

**PDSC Financial Report:** Chief Financial Officer Moreno advised the trustees that the Corporation received an allotment check today from DOA, bringing PDSC at 81%

of our FY2019 budget.

**APD Financial Report:** We invoiced Judiciary for the 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter allotment on April 3, 2019, we are awaiting transmittal of funds for APD.

**DVP Financial Report:** We issued to Federal Programs a request for reimbursement for March, 2019.

Chief Justice Maraman advised the board that as Chairwoman of the Judicial Council, she received a letter from APD that there was technical correction to their budget. Annie Gayle mentioned to the board approved that when they removed the Legal Secretary Supervisor position, it decreased APD's total budget by 1%. That was the only correction. The total budget request is for a \$10,486.00 decrease.

**B. PDSC EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT (EXHIBIT A)**

Executive Director Hattori went over PDSC's 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter Statistics that show that the office picked-up 305 new cases; which is about the same amount as the last quarter.

**C. APD MANAGING ATTORNEY'S REPORT (EXHIBIT B)**

Managing Attorney Gayle reviewed their office's second quarter statistics. Their numbers show that they picked-up 93 new cases. From the previous quarter, we had 97 new cases.

Chief Justice Maraman asked if there are any attorney vacancies to which MA Gayle confirms there are two vacancies for attorneys. They need to find replacements for Attorney Spivey and the other for Attorney Flynn.

Chief Justice Maraman added that as a part of Old Business from the previous meeting, she did send a letter to Senator Terlaje asking to convene a round table meeting to discuss PDSC's role in civil litigation. She has not received a response back from the Senator's office. Administrative Director Gogue advised the board that she called to follow up on such request with the Senator's office. She was advised that there is a round table discussion that will happen on May 6<sup>th</sup> at 1:00PM. AD Gogue will advise the board members of the meeting details via email.

**VII. NEW BUSINESS:**

CFO Moreno advised the board that APD's budget submitted and approved by Judicial Council for FY2019 was subject to legislative approval. Based on the amount that was actually authorized by the Legislature, and what is being requested for FY2020 is not a decrease in the amount requested. The actual approved budget was \$1,160,046; from this amount to what is being requested by APD for FY2020 is an increase of \$211,008. APD should not use the amount that they request from Judicial Council because it is not what was authorized by the Legislature. Chief Justice Maraman advised MA Gayle that there will be a Judicial Council meeting where the change in budget needs to be presented.

Chief Justice Maraman and Presiding Judge Lamorena requested that CFO Moreno be at the meeting as well.

**The board went into Executive Session at 1:01PM.**

**The trustees reconvened at 1:30PM.**

**VIII. EXECUTIVE SESSION**

Chief Justice Maraman announced that with respect to the matters that were brought up during the Executive Session, the requested pay for the APD employee asking for promised compensation is denied. The above-step recruitment for Ms. Aguon and Mr. Dizon were denied.

Presiding Judge Lamorena added that the best place to address the salary of attorneys is through the Legislature. He further explained that he knows how difficult it is to recruit attorneys based on the current pay scale. As a board, we are reluctant to Above-step everybody who applies at the office as opposed to addressing the real issue of low salary compensation with the Legislature so that everyone is treated equally. Presiding Judge Lamorena stated that he will support the PD 100% when the time comes for the Legislature to review attorney salaries. It has been over 20 years since the pay scale has been changed, and it is time that such review and adjustments be made.

**IX. PUBLIC DISCUSSION:**

None.

**X. ADJOURNMENT AND NEXT MEETING DATE:**

Presiding Judge Lamorena moved to adjourn the meeting until May 28, 2019 or June 25, 2019 or even early July. There being no objections, motion carried.
